R = Ring CH = Chain SR = Split Ring

h1 = 1st half stitch h2 = 2nd half stitch "+" = join

"-" = very small picot "- -" = large decorative picot

"= or p" = next picot to be joined . = close ring

slj = shuttle lock join rw = reverse work

scjip = Split Chain Join with Incorporated Picot

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First Round

Begin first ring leaving 6" thread end. With exception of first ring, the first stitch of the subsequent rings is made as a lark's head picot join (LPHJ). This is done by drawing a joining loop of the shuttle thread and forming the luggage tag loops and then wrapping the hand with the shuttle thread and placing the shuttle through the loops that will make the larks head stitch of the join and count as the first DS of the stitch count.

R A: 1 – 7 – 1 (5h1/5h2) 1 – 9 = 1.

R B: 2 – 3 – 2 – 1.

R C: 9 – 1 (5h1/5h2) 1 – 7 – 1.

SR D: 4 / 4.

Cut the shuttle thread. Tie an overhand knot in both thread ends, trim as antenna and use as a doodle butterfly, or add the second round.

Second Round

Thread a 24" length of thread through the join point RC/SRD. Begin a direct method chain working the second round counterclockwise. Note all chains are made using direct method with the exception of chains (c) and (i) which are flipped.

Cha: 16 – 1 slj (2nd p RC)

CHb: 2 (5h1/5h2) 1 scjip (1st p RC, change direction and flip next chain.

CHc: 1 scjip (p CHb) 3 (5h1/5h2) 4 slj (p CHa), change direction and direct method next chain.

CHd: 6 (6h1/6h2) 5 slj (p CHb)
